INCREASING CAPACITY FROM PASTOR BOB ANDERSON

I went to my physician's office today for a checkup appointment. The helpful nurse led me to the scale. Hmm... I figured that might "game" the outcome if I removed my coat, my phone, keys, shoes. I added my reading glasses to the pile as well. Oh no! Still too much – I gained more weight than I thought. Sigh!



It occurred to me that I was feeling like I entered a time warp with the disciples in Mark 9.26 as they attempted to cast out a demonic influence – to no avail. They reported back to Jesus about their failure and he replied (Mark 9.29): *This kind only goes out with prayer and fasting!*

Somehow ten pounds had slyly crept onto my body over the last few months. And I'm thinking that they will only go with "prayer and fasting"! I let my guard down and the calories (despite the calorie count totals on the menus) packed my body.



Since it is now Lent, my encounter with the scale seems an apt consideration. Prayer and fasting are Lenten themes that point to prayerful soul searching that's needed to control the passions of our flesh. Indeed, the weight "crept" onto me, without notice. It was until the accumulation of weight made a difference did I notice.

The word, "lent" comes from a Latin root word, "lengthen". It's related to the lengthening of the days of spring. My girth has lengthened (perhaps widened is the correct word!).

Let's move this image to a more positive note that will encourage your spiritual journey this Lenten season. We usually think of Lent in terms of "giving up" or "losing". Since my Lent has begun with "gaining weight", let's think of Lent as a time of gaining spiritual "capacity". Our soul searching, prayer and scripture reflection this Lenten season is an opportunity for increasing, broadening, deepening our spiritual lives – *increasing capacity*.

You must find your own pattern that fits your life, but I'll share one thing that I've done. The morning after Ash Wednesday, the ashes on my forehead were gone, but my heart wanted to be full. I decided to practice a discipline each day as a way to consistently stretch my faith capacity and my love of Jesus. Each morning on my Facebook page I include the image of the ashen cross above, along with a thought and scripture passage that reflects my morning devotional time. The practice itself strengthens my discipline. Prayerful reflection brings to mind scripture that I will use and sometimes a brief thought occurs. My heart will get "cleaned up" by prayer and fasting!

You are welcome to look at my Facebook page to see my capacity increase each day – just remember, Lent's 40 days do not include Sunday. You'll have to come to church to worship and hear God's word that has grown in my heart that week!

PNC UPDATE FROM MATT FISCHER



We want to update you on your PNC's progress. To date, we were briefed by Presbytery regarding the entire pastor nominating process. We completed our committee covenant (a set of rules on how we will interact with each other and as a committee throughout the process). We also finished our SWOO analysis document (strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and obstacles) and shared this with our Committee on Ministry, Liaison, Lisa Allgood.

The PNC also hosted Bill Morley, a member of the Pastoral Discernment Team, and he shared the report they created over the past several years. It was an extremely productive meeting, and the report is thorough, thoughtful and contains useful information and recommendations. The committee was pleased to see that the PDT report aligns nicely with the Holy Cow! evaluation, the PCW Mission Study and our SWOO document.

We started work on formatting the Mission Study document to reflect the personality, vitality, and energy of our congregation. The idea is to bring it to life with pictures, data, and a narrative that accurately reflects who we are today, but more importantly, and with God's help, what we aspire to be in the future. We intend to share this document with you when it is complete because we believe it will make us all proud. We are also starting work on our MIF (Ministry Information Form). The MIF is what prospective candidates will initially see when looking for a congregational match. It is an important document, and we are treating it as such.

On April 7th, the PNC will visit the Senior High Youth Group's Sunday night meeting to get their input into what they want in a new pastor for PCW. Then on April 8th, Rob Keelor and Steve Wilson (PNC members who are also Session Members) will update the Session on the PNC.

We are pleased with the progress we have made in a short period of time. Our committee is strong, united and extremely positive as we listen to discern God's will and plan for PCW. Please keep us and our work in your prayers.

ADULT DISCIPLESHIP FROM ROB KEELOR



We will be continuing our march through the desert with the children of Israel and completing the "**The Tabernacle - The Dwelling Place of God**" series before the Easter celebration. Then we will turn our attention to the "**New Covenant of Jesus Christ - Our Hope & Faith in Action.**"

During this Lenten season we commonly look at fasting, prayer, devotion, and sacrifice. By looking at the Tabernacle of the Old Testament, we can learn much about (1) God's plan of redemption through history, and Christ's ultimate fulfillment of the same, (2) how, before Christ, a sinful people could approach a holy God and receive grace and mercy, (3) how the priesthood is foundational to understanding Christ's priestly ministry, (4) how the sacrificial system within the Tabernacle teaches of the importance of a blood sacrifice to atone for sin, (5) how a good grasp of the Tabernacle is essential in understanding much of the Book of Hebrews and other portions of the New Testament. We can then celebrate the Easter and the New Covenant together, drawing near to God, the author and finisher of our faith!

ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING

Do you remember One Great Hour of Sharing? You may recall your children coming home with little cardboard boxes shaped like a little fish, a collection box for feeding the hungry of the world, just like Jesus did for over 5,000 people. PCW is going to begin anew to participate in our worldwide Presbyterian Church offering that is used to feed and assist those in need.



In 1978, I served a church in Boston when we were hit with a surprise blizzard that dumped nearly 4 feet of snow on the region. Thousands along the coast lost their homes and the city was shut down for over a week until the U.S. Army could get equipment in to plow streets. The region was declared a disaster area but the miracle of God was that the Presbyterian Church had *already* begun to send One Great Hour funds to assist in the recovery. What a grand witness to God's grace manifest through God's people!

What was even more of a blessing to me is that our little urban multi-ethnic church of Hispanics and Anglos was in the midst collecting our OGHS offering to help others – when we began to receive help from One Great Hour sharing!

The impact of that event stirs my heart today! PCW will be taking a special offering on **Palm Sunday, March 14th**.. Let us open our doors, and open our hearts, and give generously! If we all do a little it adds up to be a lot! To contribute please make checks payable to PCW and put OGHS in the memo line."

KIDS ARE PARTICIPATING AND PARENTS ARE TOO!

You might remember that we launched a series of children's classes during the 10 a.m. hour back in the fall. The first one was an African Dance class for kids followed by a children's choir. We took several weeks off and then came back in February with an Animal class and a Yoga class. All of these classes have been super well attended with over 40 total kids participating at least once and over 20 kids participating regularly.

We offered a children's yoga class every Sunday in March, which was our best attended class yet. We handed the parents a brief survey on that first day of children's yoga. The survey simply asked the parents what they would prefer to do while their children were in their classes.

(Yes, we had to create two separate classes for the kids because we had so many participate). The parents overwhelmingly told us that they would prefer to have their own adult yoga class! So we invited one of the Healing Space yoga practitioners to help us out and offered adult yoga the very next Sunday. The only problem we faced during adult yoga was that we almost ran out of room as we had about a dozen parents participate!

We are excited that God is opening up the doors on Sunday morning to new kids and new parents. We are excited that these young people are learning how to be aware of one other, how to be thoughtful and kind, and how to stretch and move their bodies in such positive ways!

God is on the move and we are trying to catch up! Please help us by keeping all the young people in your prayers.



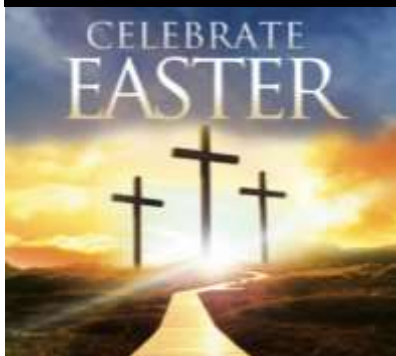
WELCOME REBECCA BOSARGE
