



A NEW VISION

Our Vision Statement is a picture of a desired state – whom is God calling us to become? The Mission Study Team worked for many of hours, individually and as a group to digest the Holy Cow! Mission report as well as with Session interaction. The Mission Study Team began wondering about our church ministry and asking the question, “Why?” Why do we exist, why do we do what we do? Why? Why? Why? Their work was distilled by our Session, and from this statement the “how and what” of our life (programs, ministry, etc.) began to form. From this new Vision Statement will flow leadership initiatives to prepare us for a new installed pastor and a new future. You will begin to see the statement frequently, and you are invited to reflect on the “Why” question for yourself!

PCW Vision Statement:

Learning together to be followers of Jesus Christ, reflecting God’s light into the world.

Emphasis:

Welcoming young families into our multigenerational faith journey.

Focus Areas:

Worship, Fellowship, Mission

Rationale or explanation. A Vision Statement is like poetry: every word is critical and has profound meaning, selected after deep prayer, inspiration and discussion.

“Learning” – Following Jesus is a continuous journey, wherein we are constantly striving to better follow the Lord. “Teaching and learning” was one of the top priorities coming from the congregational survey.
Luke 24:32

“Together” – Although we certainly learn and pray on our own, there is a richness that comes when we do so as a small group or a larger congregation. *Matthew 18:20*

“Followers of Jesus Christ” – Many people believe in God, but only Christians believe in Jesus, His Son. Jesus most often told His disciples to “Follow me!” A disciple or follower strives both to learn the teachings of Jesus and to live by His example. We considered the word “disciples” but found that “followers” is more understandable in modern usage. *John 8:12*

“Reflecting God’s light” -- God brought Jesus as a shining light into a murky, broken world that still exists today. The image of PCW as a light continuously appeared to our team as we prayed and studied, walked around the church, and described what we envision for PCW in the future. It is our important role as Christians to be the hands and feet of Jesus in the world, to let His light shine through us. *Mark 4:21*

LENT FROM PASTOR BOB ANDERSON



Our Christian Lenten season begins the Sunday following Ash Wednesday. This is a forty-day season traditionally given to personal soul searching, confession, forgiveness and spiritual enrichment. Ash Wednesday is the traditional beginning of the Lenten season. Our PCW Ash Wednesday service will follow the services in our Book of Common Worship. Bill Seale, Director of Music Ministry, is arranging some special music for this night that will help create an atmosphere for “soul searching” and personal confession. We will sing hymns and pray together. I will lead a meditation from the Scriptures that will help us focus on how to grow in our faith during Lent. The Service of Imposition of Ashes will be included in the service for those who would like to receive the ashes. The imposition of ashes in the sign of the cross is a reminder that we were created from the dust of the earth and one day will return to dust. With that in mind we seek to live humbly (literally, “close to the ground”) before our Creator who fashioned us and has a design for our lives.

The term “Lent” is rooted in the Latin word from which get the word “lengthen”. This forty-day season accompanies the lengthening of days in spring. One might then consider Lent as a time of “lengthening” our spiritual lives – growing longer, deeper, richer. What spiritual practices will help you do that? During Lent our sermon series will be about prayer. This may be a practice that will help you “lengthen” your spiritual life.

Here’s another thought: A theme of “giving up” something is often associated with Lent – as in fasting! However, you might consider other ways to approach a spiritual discipline for Lent. As I wrote elsewhere in this Crossroads, you might try giving “honor” to someone who “rubs you the wrong way”. You might consider “giving away” (rather than giving “up”). Give away to the poor, increase your giving to the church, give away a listening ear to someone who needs encouragement, give away patience... be creative!

Please, join us for Ash Wednesday service, **March 6th, at 7 p.m.** in the Sanctuary.





The Tabernacle - The Dwelling Place of God

During this Lenten season we commonly look at fasting, prayer, devotion, and sacrifice. By looking at the Tabernacle of the Old Testament, we can learn much about (1) God's plan of redemption through history, and Christ's ultimate fulfillment of the same, (2) how, before Christ, a sinful people could approach a holy God and receive grace and mercy, (3) how the priesthood is foundational to understanding Christ's priestly ministry, (4) how the sacrificial system within the Tabernacle teaches of the importance of

a blood sacrifice to atone for sin, (5) how a good grasp of the Tabernacle is essential in understanding much of the Book of Hebrews and other portions of the New Testament, (6) and much, much more. Susan Anderson has graciously agreed to teach us about this relevant and timely topic with fascinating graphical detail.

LENT BIBLE VERSES

Philippians 3:10-11 ¹⁰ I want to know Christ - yes, to know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, ¹¹ and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead.

1 Peter 5:6 ⁶ Humble yourselves, therefore, under God's mighty hand, that he may lift you up in due time.

Matthew 6:16-18 ¹⁶ "When you fast, do not look somber as the hypocrites do, for they disfigure their faces to show others they are fasting. PASTORAL NOMINATING COMMITTEE (PNC)

The Pastoral Nominating Committee was elected on February 10 at our PCW Annual Meeting of the Congregation. The seven members were elected to represent our congregation in the search for the next installed Pastor. And they will deal with an *overflow of acronyms*. Read on!

On February 17th the Presbytery engaged the PNC in an Orientation Session that will allow them to begin to meet and begin the next steps in the process. The first big task will be to write a Church Information Form (CIF). This document will present PCW to pastors who are open to considering a new call. The General Assembly Church Leadership Connection will post the CIF in an online presence for Pastors to consider. These pastors have completed and filed a Personal Information Form (PIF) on the Church Leadership Connection web site.

How are candidates selected? There are several avenues for the PNC to follow. The first is "matching". The General Assembly software will send to the PNC the names of potential candidates that match certain criteria in the PCW Mission Information Form (MIF). The PNC can also search through the data base and connect with candidates they select. Some ministers will "self-refer", which means that they will see the PCW availability and send their PIF for consideration. One more way is for PCW members who may know ministers who are considering a move can refer their name to the PNC.

The PNC will be reporting regularly to the congregation, and it will be our task to keep this group in our prayers. May we be faithful in our intercession for God's will to be fulfilled at The Presbyterian Church of Wyoming.

Ash Wednesday - March 6, 7 p.m.

Matthew 28: 19-20

'Into our multigenerational faith journey' – And yet we cannot abandon our current members, both young and old. So we welcome the new and celebrate those that are already with us, learning and following Jesus together. *Psalms 145:4*

'Worship, Fellowship and Mission' – Beyond welcoming young families into PCW and education/learning, the other high priorities coming from the congregational survey are:

- Strengthen our Worship experience. *John 4:24*
- Increase opportunities for meaningful Fellowship. *Acts 2:42*
- Focus on Mission. This was the highest priority among the young, those we seek to have join us for the future. *1 John 3:17*

Limiting our focus to three areas should allow PCW and Session to transform, concentrate and grow without getting bogged down in trying to do too much.
