Psalm 19 says:

It's all around us! The whole world is continually talking to us, and wonder is a way we can listen.

The Session of PCW voted unanimously and enthusiastically to make space available at PCW to house the Reading-Lockland (R-L) Summer Program in the Summer of 2019 from June 3, 2019 - August 9, 2019. With the closing of the Reading-Lockland Presbyterian Church, which has housed this program for many years, the program was left without a venue. We at PCW are excited to be partnering with New Direction Youth Academy (NDYA), Inc. to provide 60-80 youth of our communities with the opportunity to learn, eat, have fun and be surrounded by wonderful, loving and supportive staff of NDYA and members of PCW. The program runs Monday-Friday from 7:45am-1:30pm. This program serves children and youth from age 3 to age 17. It provides them with a free breakfast and lunch every day along with classes in writing, reading, math, art, character education and gym. Teachers from the Cincinnati Public Schools are teaching the classes, and Tyrone Wilson is directing the program. This is a wonderful Spirit-led opportunity for PCW to live into our new vision and mission! We are now working on the logistics to ready our space for the program, including clearing our kitchen refrigerator to make way for the childrens' breakfasts and lunches! We have been working with the groups that use the refrigerator on alternate plans, but if you have a concern or haven't been contacted, please contact Cheryl Albrecht, 513.225.6851 or Leslie Mowry, 513.761.7493. We are confident that we can make it work for everyone with some flexibility and creative thinking!

Volunteer opportunities are being discussed, and possible ways to serve include (times are approximate):

1. Monitoring the entrance from 7:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m.
(flexible on how much time you give - all or part of the time)
2. Helping with breakfast set-up 7:45 a.m. -8:45am
3. Helping to sign in students from 7:30am-9am
4. Helping with lunch set-up 11:45am-12:45pm
5. Hanging out with the kids while they eat their lunch 11:45am-1:00pm
6. Helping in the classes as needed and escorting kids during class changes from 8:50am-11:50am
7. Helping with the signout of students 12:45pm-1:30pm
8. Readyng the Great Room for services on Sunday and then readyng the Great Room for classes on Monday.

PNC UPDATE FROM MATT FISCHER

We want to update you on your PNC's progress, and a lot has transpired since the last month's update!

We are in listening and discovery mode. The PNC visited our Senior High Youth Group on April 7th to get their input on why our church (and the youth group) is a relevant part of their lives and faith journeys. They did not disappoint, and the feedback will be incorporated into the overall narrative we are creating. Also we met with Don Hoffman, our Clerk of Session, and we invited Pastor Bob to join us for obvious reasons. In Pastor Bob's distinguished career as an interim pastor, he has successfully guided many congregations through the pastor nominating process, and who better to tap into for wisdom and guidance throughout this journey?

In addition to these conversations we are working on completing the MIF (Ministry Information Form) which will be used to match us with prospective candidates. A component of that document required us to select 10 leadership competencies that we believe are needed for this role. There is a list of 33 skills to choose from in the following categories, Theological/Spiritual Interpreter, Organizational Leadership, and Interpersonal Engagement. We completed this task with healthy debate, and we are happy to report that there is strong agreement on the top ten competencies we're seeking from prospective candidates.

The committee will also visit and observe worship services at several other Presbyterian churches in our area that are reported to be doing well and growing. We hope to gain insights that will also help us tell our PCW narrative in a more meaningful and relevant way. Last but not least, we are pleased to tell you that your Session and PNC are working together on every level to do the things that need to be done to prepare us as a united church and congregation for the calling of a new head pastor. The level of trust and cooperation we feel not only encourages us in our work, but it also inspires us because we see firsthand the dedication of our faithful brothers and sisters and how God is at work within our church!
